

From the Pastor:

Do you remember how much preparation was required for the birth of your first child? We have to get a crib! We have to take birthing classes! We have to make monthly doctor's appointments. We have to prepare the birth announcements to send out! We have to pack a bag for the hospital stay! We have to make sure the bag is by the front door every night during the last month! And about a million other things I have blocked from my memory. It was a lot of intentional work to get ready for the baby, and it all needed to be done at once, thus all those exclamation marks.

As we enter the season of Advent, we prepare spiritually for the coming of the Child of Bethlehem into our lives. And this to takes work to prepare. But the spiritual preparations are different than that for physical preparation. During the Season of Advent we embrace particular themes to guide our spiritual preparation.

Week 1—Do Less, Don't let all the tasks to be done to prepare for Christmas cause you to miss Jesus. What might you let go of, or even not do to be more present with Christ this Advent.

Week 2—Experience Wonder, Don't let exhaustion diminish your wonder at all the WONDER-FULL things God is doing all around you. How can you experience wonder for God's works and be fed by wonder in the midst of this busy season?

Week 3—Hold on to Hope, Our troubles do not go away just because Christmas is coming. How can we hold on to hope in the midst of the world's troubles?

Week 4—Embrace Hope, The Christmas holiday is often an emotionally dark time for people. To embrace hope mean to cling to Christ's hope even if we don't feel it, and not to give in to despair.

Having a Merry Christmas requires doing the life giving work of Advent.

It's the Christmas Season, also known as the "Season of Giving". There are so many ways that we can help our little ones give. At Christ Lutheran School we ask for students to bring in canned goods, grocery store gift cards, and unwrapped toys. These are things that we collect that go to those who aren't as blessed as we are. And we offer them with our prayers and hope that the next year things will improve for those in need.

A few years ago, I bought a goat for my students. That's right a real, live goat. But we didn't have to figure out who was going to watch it on the weekends. I purchased the goat through Heifer International, a charity that places livestock with families in need. It provides the training needed to care for an animal. That animal gives the family a way to make money. In return, the family must give some of the animal's offspring back to the program so that they can be sent to new families. We received updates throughout the year telling us that our goat had arrived. We learned that the milk from the goat can be used for basic nutrition, and excess milk can be sold. Families are even taught how to turn that excess milk into cheese, which brings in even more money. It's an amazing program. I highly recommend you look into it.

Buying that goat for my kids was a neat experience, but something even more wonderful came from it. I started getting email from my students' families. They told their families about this really cool goat and how the program worked. My students asked their families if they could buy livestock too. One goat turned into 3 goats, a flock of chickens, and a cow. Five years later, I'm still amazed.

As an adult, we realize that giving sometimes comes from a place of sacrifice. If we send \$100 to charity, it's \$100 less that we have to spend or to save. But I don't think our children understand that giving and sacrifice go hand-in-hand. It's our job as parents to teach them this, but we don't. I'm guilty of this. I take my kids to Target to get something for the toy drive, only to get them each a little something too. I am teaching them that giving is important, but I'm not teaching them that sometimes in order to give we have to give up. I'm not helping them make a Jesus-like sacrifice. He gave, and He gave of himself, until He had nothing left to give. And then He gave His life. Truly a sacrifice that meant giving it all.

How do we teach our children to make a sacrifice when giving? Is it necessary to teach them this? I don't know the answer to either question, but I do know that if I'm encouraging them to live "like Jesus" they will need to learn that sacrifice is often a part of giving.

What do you think?

And speaking of sacrifice...have you wanted to find a place to serve, but weren't too sure that you had the time to commit? Want to work with children, but not all the time? The Music Corner

Joy to the World!

Surprisingly, this hymn was not written for Christmas. Rather, Isaac Watts wrote the hymn as a paraphrase of the last five verses in Psalm 98 for his 1719 publication, The Psalms of David Imitated. In this hymnal, Watts rewrites many of the psalms using a Christological lens. His versification of Psalm 98 is no different. Verse nine of the psalm reads, "...let them sing before the LORD, for he comes to judge the earth. He will judge the world in righteousness and the peoples with equity." Watts unapologetically interprets this as a reference to Christ. The theme of "Christ coming" made it an popular hymn to be sung at Christmastime, and it has since become one of the most beloved Christmas carols.

Albert Bailey writes, "It is one of the most joyous Christmas hymns in existence; not in the sense of merry-making but in the deep and solemn realization of what Christ's birth has meant to mankind" (The Gospel in Hymns, 54). Watt's text has almost been left untouched by editors, with one exception. The line "far as the curse is found" is left out of many hymnals, since there is no reference to this "curse" in the actual psalm. However, when seen through the eyes of the New Testament and Gospel message, the reference to Genesis 3:17-18 becomes quite clear.

In Genesis 3, one of the great tragedies in all of Scripture occurs. Adam and Eve sin against God, and are banished from the garden as God puts a curse upon the ground. It is a heartbreaking rupture in God's perfect creation, and it is hard not to read this text without feeling a twinge of despair. And yet, before the curse comes a promise. God declares that the woman shall bear offspring that will crush the head of the serpent. Jesus, the Son of Man and Son of God, will come to break the curse, to renew the creation, to make whole what is now broken.

In Psalm 98, all of creation is called upon to make a joyful noise before God, for the Lord has come to "judge the earth," and restore His Creation. We should not fail to see our own hand at work in the destruction of creation, in our sins of waste and decadence. This "judgment of the earth" is, in some part, a judgment of us as caretakers. But God is merciful and full of grace, and rather than leave everything in our hands, He gives us the Life-giver. In this beautiful hymn, Isaac Watts makes the connection between the coming of Christ into this world and the beginning of that restoration. Christ brings "joy to the world," a light where there is darkness, growth where there is decay. And we, along with all Creation, respond with a song of praise.




